

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It's been 3 months since the last Flypaper, so apologise for the delay. A lot has happened and even more so, since COVID-19 and the lockdown. As you will be aware there is no flying (private or club) for the next 4 weeks or so. We will eventually get through this crisis, even though it is hard to see what the other side will look like.

For now, it's good to celebrate the many successes our club has had over this season. Piako Gliding Club is currently number 17 in the world and number 1 in New Zealand for OLC points. Collectively our pilots have glided cross country over 43,000 km (that's more than the circumference of the planet). Biggest contributor was Tim Bromhead flying over 10,000 km, with a few others not too far behind.

Raglan was enjoyable, though lift generally a bit less than previous years. There was one spectacular West Coast ridge day flown by club members and a few Auckland Enterprise pilots. ## **RECENT ACTIVITY**

Up until the lockdown we had some excellent gliding days which allowed some of our pilots to achieve tasks and personal goals. Nick Odom flew his first solo on a lovely clear Wednesday afternoon and thoroughly enjoyed the achievement. The following week our new club member Colin Kelly also did a glider solo with us, Colin is an experienced retired airline pilot and is now a tow pilot with us and apparently flew solo in gliders very many years when he was a young man.

Also pleasing to report that we have had no incidents or accidents over the last couple of months.

Tim Bromhead had a couple of very good long distance flights and has made a claim for the MacPherson Trophy with a 300km flight return to Matamata via Thames and Pureora. Steve Care and Genny Healey have claimed a Catlin Trophy flight with a nicely executed 100km flight.

## **HOW WE DO THINGS**

Pilots will have noticed that we have changed the launch point when operating on runway 10. The caravan is now positioned in front of the Clubhouse, about 50 metres towards the 10 threshold from the Clubhouse building. ### Even More Snippets

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

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

